We teach our children to read so that they can read to learn

Supporting your child with reading

Although your child will be taught to read at school, you can have a huge impact on their reading journey by continuing their practice at home.

There are two types of reading book that your child may bring home: A reading practice book. This will be at the correct phonic stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently.

A sharing book - a Bedtime Book and a Library book (both in their special bags). Your child may not be able to read this on their own. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.

Reading practice book - this is the book your child is bringing home to practise the phonics they have learned in school - you can comment on this book in this Reading Record Book

This book has been carefully matched to your child's current reading level. If your child is reading it with little help, please don't worry that it's too easy – it's something to celebrate! Your child is reading it to you to develop fluency and confidence in reading. Your child may also be assigned an eBook (your teacher will give you a log in).

Listen to them read the book. Remember to give them lots of praise – celebrate their success! If they can't read a word, read it to them. After they have finished, talk about the book together.

Bedtime Book and Library book - building a love of reading

In order to encourage your child to become a lifelong reader, it is important that they learn to read for pleasure. We have carefully selected the Bedtime Books so that your child reads the highest quality picture books and this sharing book is a book they have chosen for you to enjoy together.

Please remember that you shouldn't expect your child to read this alone. Read it to or with them. Discuss the pictures, enjoy the story, predict what might happen next, use different voices for the characters, explore the facts in a nonfiction book. But most importantly, enjoy it together!
