As the term draws to a close, I would like to take the opportunity to reflect on the great progress and many successes of the year. I am so proud of our children, staff, and governors and would like to thank them for their hard work, dedication, and remarkable resilience.

The year started with a very successful OFSTED inspection. We were delighted with the outcome and so pleased that they recognised that we are inclusive, have high expectations and that we enable pupils to broaden their horizons and support their wider development.

We are a school that continually tries to improve and we regularly review our curriculum offer to your children to ensure that it is outstanding. We are proud of the curriculum we provide and your children have made such progress in their learning this year and the provisional outcomes look good. We are delighted with our decision to adopt the OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning) approach to play times alongside the Junior School. This has provided such wonderful opportunities for the children and it has helped to smooth the transition into year 3 for our year 2 children. We have exciting plans for the next stage, which will be shared with you in the new term. We are working towards the Platinum Award.

We are so fortunate to work within such a fantastic community. Your support and involvement are so vital and are the key to our success. The money raised from your fundraising and voluntary donations are becoming increasingly vital and we really can't thank you enough. This year, with your help, we have been able to keep our Forest School Provision, develop our outdoor play provision, and replenish our book stock. Our PTA has worked tirelessly to raise funds. We know how hard this can be in the current climate and we appreciate all of your efforts. The Summer Fair alone has raised around £9,000 profit. Many thanks to Rachel, Jessica, Eleanor and the whole team. We are also so proud of the CHIPTA Celebrating Diversity team and the work they are doing to support equality for all.

The site here at Coombe Hill is one of the things that makes our school so unique. We are incredibly fortunate to have such a beautiful environment and amazing facilities, including our swimming pool. The amount of work and resources needed to keep the grounds well maintained is vast and, from a financial point of view, is challenging. The governors and staff are currently thinking of ways to involve parents in

helping us. We are delighted that we now have a new, experienced site manager, Daniel Butler, to oversee the work and a new, experienced interim school business manager, Lauren Nardin.

Finally, well done to our wonderful children. It is so rewarding to watch them grow and make progress, and we are very proud of them all. Good luck to the children leaving us next week, and we look forward to welcoming our new cohort in September.

It has been an absolute privilege to work at this amazing school for 28 years and lead it for 13 of those years. I wish you all the very best and have every confidence that the school will continue to evolve and be successful.

Within the board itself, we're also looking to some changes in the autumn, with some governors moving on, and some fresh new faces wanting to get stuck in, including our new parent governor, Steph Carran, and new staff governor, Miss Matheson.

#### Attendance this week

Our overall attendance target is 96%. Our overall attendance across the school this week is **95.41%**. The highest attendance of the week is for **Otter class** with **98.67%** attendance, followed by **Bee, Lion and Leopard classes**, all with over **97%**. Well done to these classes.

With the end of term next week we are pleased to see that our overall attendance for the year will be above our target of 96%. Thank you to all of our families who have ensured that their child has attended school whenever they are well enough to do so this year. High attendance in school is so important to your child's academic achievement, their wellbeing, and to their wider development. Regular school attendance is a key mechanism in supporting children and young people's educational, economic and social outcomes. We will continue to monitor every child's attendance closely from their first day in school in September, in partnership with the Junior school, where we have shared families.


