Dear Families,

We are very proud of the children and how they managed this exciting week of "change". The Reception and Year 1 children visited their new classrooms on Wednesday and met their new teachers. They spent the whole morning engaged in exciting activities including preparing coat peg names and artwork for display etc ready for September. The Year 2 children had visits from their new teachers the day before they spent the whole of Wednesday in the Junior School - this included having lunch in the Junior Hall where they were looked after by their Year 5 buddies. The children have talked about their emotions this week - a mixture of excited, anxious, and nervous - so please take a look at the Shazia workshop information below about helping your child manage these emotions. Ladybird class will meet their new Hedgehog class teacher, Miss Bransfield, next week and she is very much looking forward to getting to know them.

This week we have been using our Learning Behaviours to think about Relationships and good friendships. Rabbit teaches us to listen to our friends, use kind words and to look out for each other. Next week we will be thinking about how Owl helps us to think about the best way to learn, to change things if they are not working and think about what we have learnt. I am good at solving

problems!


How parents can help

Encourage children to...

- talk about the day and what they learned and maybe tell them what you learned today too
- try a different approach if their model/project/drawing is not working out
- work together to help find solutions •

We aim to take a person centred approach and will therefore adapt our relationship and behaviour policy depending on the child, their age (brain development research), SEND, their lived experiences and any trauma they may have endured. If there is a child who finds the school environment difficult for whatever reason and is unable at times to follow the school rules, having discussions with your child at home about how we are all different will really help them to manage their feelings about this. We use the Equality vs Equity poster with staff to show how some children need more than other children at times, depending on what they are going through and how they are feeling in that moment. This can be difficult for all children to understand. Please do let us know if your child is finding this hard and we will take some time to discuss it with them in more detail.




Shazia's Mental Health & Wellbeing Workshops

Attachment Awareness School Award (AASA) - Silver Award

We have received the Silver Attachment Awareness School Award this year, as a recognition of the commitment we have made and the steps the school has taken, to further develop a culture of compassion and nurture. This plays a pivotal role in getting our children and young people into a state of 'learning readiness'. Huge thanks to Mrs Heard who has led us on this journey.



As a part of the award this year; we introduced Zones of Regulation as a whole school approach, continued our annual training for staff on Attachment Awareness and Emotion Coaching, adapted our Relationship and Behaviour Policy further to include more information on Emotion Coaching and started to develop a child friendly version of this policy. We have also worked closely with Coombe Hill Juniors and the Mental health support team (Shazia) to provide workshops and training to school staff, coombe connections staff, parents and children.

The silver award recognises and celebrates best practice in attachment and trauma aware schools and settings and is all about embedding the approach with all school staff. At Coombe Hill Infants' we believe strongly that relationships are at the core of everything we do. This is a particular strength of our school. Well done to all of the children involved in the project this year, their voices, ideas and input was at the heart of the project and ultimately helped us to achieve the award.


