# Reception "Minibeasts" theatre workshop

Today the Matrix theatre gave workshops to our Reception classes to further their knowledge of mini beasts. The children dressed up as spiders, caterpillars, bees, dragonflies and even pond snails as we learned some interesting facts about them. We saw how some butterflies have patterns on their wings that look like eyes so they are less likely to be attacked by birds and that gardeners love ladybirds as they feed on aphids that eat flowers and plants. The children had a wonderful time whilst learning new facts.

- If the pet is in a large cage or tank, you can drop it off between 7.45 and 8am to the ICT suite, please come to the school office entrance and we will let you through
