Dear Families,





- 'Sunflowers' by Vincent van Gogh


In addition, we have been reading the 'Katie' books by James Mayhew. Katie visits the gallery with her Grandma and has adventures inside the paintings.

Neal Zetter, award-winning poet/author visit


Next **Thursday 13th March**, Neal Zetter, the poet is visiting us again and there will be an opportunity to buy his books. Neal will be book signing after school from 3pm outside the Library on the day of his visit. The books are £9 each.

You can order signed copies of the books in two ways:

- You can pay with cash or by card on the day;
 OR
- Bring payment to the school office in a named envelope in advance of Neal's visit exact change please, write your child's name on the envelope and state which book(s) you would like to buy, you can then collect your book(s) on the day or have them put in your child's blue bag. Deadline Tuesday 11th March midday.







All books are for reading ages 6-12 years, but younger children will enjoy many of the poems if they are read to them.

- £9: (NEW! NEW! NEW!) The Shape of Rainbows. My first mixed-themed poetry book since 2016 has something for everyone: Peanut Butter Nutter, Police Car, Two Mums, Living Next Door to a Viking, Bad Smells and The Day I Ate My School are just a few of the titles you'll find inside it.
- £9: The Universal Zoo (The Conservation Place at the Far End of Space). Fifty funny and a few sad poems wonderfully and comically illustrated about a menagerie of mysterious endangered alien creatures all cared for by the robotic Keeper in this special place, a long way from Earth.
- £9: When the Bell Goes (A Rapping, Rhyming Trip through Childhood). Jam-crammed with fifty comical poems, plus jokes and silly facts, about Neal's (and your) journey through childhood, school days and growing up.

Celebrating your child's birthday at school

Parents sometimes ask for book suggestions either for their own children or to give to the class as a birthday gift. Vomiting and Diarrhoea

We remind all parents again that you MUST observe the <u>48 hour rule</u> regarding **vomiting and/or diarrhoea**. It is so important that your child does not attend school for a clear 48 hours after a bout of either of these symptoms, in fairness to other children and to our staff as tummy bugs can spread extremely quickly among young children. <u>Even if your child has a single bout of vomiting or diarrhoea</u> <u>and then appears well they MUST remain at home for the full 48-hour period</u>. We understand that this can be frustrating but please ensure that you do this. Cases of Norovirus are currently high nationally

We kindly ask that you do not allow your children nor younger siblings to use scooters and bikes on the school grounds outside the classrooms or towards the blue gate at morning drop off and afternoon pick up. These areas are heavily congested and accidents can quickly happen. We would also like to remind you that the area by the blue ramp gate is not monitored during the day or over the weekend and leaving scooters and bikes here is at your own risk, please use the bike shed at the end of the car park, this is less visible to the general public.

Planned absences from school

For any planned term time absences please see the following information. We strive for every child to be in school every day in order to maximise their education, learning and progress and wherever possible encourage you to arrange appointments and all holidays/travel during the 175 days of non-term days per year.

Authorised absences

If your absence request is for a hospital appointment, an emergency dental appointment, a religious observation (where the day is exclusively set apart for religious observance), a visit to another school, an entrance/ballet/music exam, please request a form from the school.

Unauthorised absences

If your leave of absence request is for any other reason than those given above **you must submit your request in writing (by letter or via email to to <u>admin@chi.rbksch.org</u>) giving full details, <u>at least 2 weeks</u> in advance of the intended absence period, addressed to Mrs Berry. Our overall attendance target is 96%. Our overall attendance this week is 95.81%. Leopard class has achieved the highest attendance this week, with 99.33%, followed by Lion class with 98.67% - well done to both classes.
