
Dear Families,

World Book Day next Thursday 6 March






Neal Zetter, award-winning poet/author visit


On **Thursday 13th March,** Neal Zetter, the poet is visiting us again and there will be an opportunity to buy his books. Neal will be book signing after school from 3pm outside the Library on the day of his visit. The books are £9 each.

You can order signed copies of the books in two ways:

- You can pay with cash or by card on the day;
 OR
- Bring payment to the school office in a named envelope in advance of Neal's visit exact change please, write your child's name on the envelope and state which book(s) you would like to buy, you can then collect your book(s) on the day or have them put in your child's blue bag.







All books are for reading ages 6-12 years, but younger children will enjoy many of the poems if they are read to them.

- £9: (NEW! NEW! NEW!) The Shape of Rainbows. My first mixed-themed poetry book since 2016 has something for everyone: Peanut Butter Nutter, Police Car, Two Mums, Living Next Door to a Viking, Bad Smells and The Day I Ate My School are just a few of the titles you'll find inside it.
- £9: The Universal Zoo (The Conservation Place at the Far End of Space). Fifty funny and a few sad poems wonderfully and comically illustrated about a menagerie of mysterious endangered alien creatures all cared for by the robotic Keeper in this special place, a long way from Earth.
- £9: When the Bell Goes (A Rapping, Rhyming Trip through Childhood). Jam-crammed with fifty comical poems, plus jokes and silly facts, about Neal's (and your) journey through childhood, school days and growing up.

Planned absences from school



SEND support service for parents across Kingston schools

The new pre and post SEND Diagnosis Support Team for Kingston and Richmond schools have asked us to pass on some information to you. The service works with parents to support them with any challenges they may have caring for their child/children. Children need to have a diagnosis or be on the pathway for an assessment. They work with parents only, not the child or young person. Some of the services that they are currently offering are as follows:

- Workshops at Kingston Town Children's Centre and Tudor Drive library (timetable available from the school office please request this and we will put in your child's blue bag)
- A drop- in clinic for parents that are not able to make the workshops (timetable available from the school office please request this and we will put in your child's blue bag)

There will be a Welcome workshop on 15th March 2025 at Moor Lane Centre Chessington, to introduce the service and to meet parents. There is a free, bookable creche available (limited spaces so early booking is recommended). Pupil Premium Grant

When your child was admitted to the school we checked their eligibility for the Pupil Premium Grant. Children in receipt of the Pupil Premium Grant receive funded benefits throughout the school year from us as a school and from the local authority. Please get in touch with us if your financial circumstances have changed since your child joined the school and their eligibility was checked and you think you may now be eligible.
