Dear Families,

This week we had our OFSTED inspection. Our last inspection was in September 2023 and the outcome of that was that we remained a Good school, but if we had a graded inspection we could be Outstanding. The inspection this week was a graded inspection. Three inspectors spent 2 days looking at our Early Years, Behaviour and Attitudes, Personal Development, Quality of Education, and Leadership and Management. Once we receive the report we will be able to share it with you.

The inspectors commented on how polite, kind, and respectful your children were. They were also impressed by their enthusiasm for learning. We are all so proud of them. Thank you for completing the online survey, we had over 120 responses which is amazing and it was great to know that we have such wonderful support from our families.
