#### Changes to school lunch ordering

We are changing the way that school lunches are ordered from January 2025. From Monday 6th January 2025, all school lunches must be ordered at least 3 days in advance via your child's ParentPay account. Even though you order lunches through Parentpay they are free of charge as all primary school children are entitled to free school meals. Many of you who have older children in the Junior school will be used to this system which has been used for some time and has proven to be effective and convenient for both you as parents and for managing lunches for the school catering team and school staff. You need to have an active ParentPay account to order lunches, so please ensure that you have activated your account by the end of this term. Please ask the school office for a reminder of how to do this if you are unsure as soon as possible and by Friday 20 December at the latest. We will be providing full information on the new system by the end of term, please look out for the email.

#### **Voluntary donation appeal**
