This half term our Jigsaw theme is dreams and goals. We have been thinking about what we are proud of and what we want to improve. To support this learning our Unicef Right of the Term is;


Rights Respecting School - Article 28 & 29

Malawi assembly

On Monday we had a visit from Eileen Speak, a former Reception teacher at CHI. She updated us on our partnership with the Namanyanga Primary School in Malawi. She told us how pleased the staff and pupils were to receive our learning pack on the theme of growing, which we sent in October. In return they sent some examples of work (see below).





It was fascinating to hear which crops are grown in Malawi. Later in 2025 we will be preparing a pack of resources on the themes of Animals & Homes. Winter illnesses on the increase - Message from Achieving for Children

We have seen a particular increase in the usual winter illnesses this week and have also received the following message from Achieving for Children, to be passed to our parent community.

"Flu and norovirus cases are on the increase. Parents and carers are reminded to encourage good hygiene habits such as using a tissue to catch coughs and sneezes, as well as regular hand washing to help protect against these illnesses. Flu vaccination helps to protect against infection and severe disease. School aged children who have missed getting the flu jab, can still get it. Parents/carers can call the school vaccination team on 0203 691 1019 or 0203 691 1043 to arrange a flu jab. Click here for more information".

A reminder that we must account for every child every day for the school register so please call or email us **every day** of your child's absence by 9.15am, even if they have been absent due to illness the previous day. In particular please note the health advice around vomiting and diarrhoea - **if your child** has diarrhoea and vomiting, they should stay home for at least 48 hours after these symptoms clear up. Please work with us to keep our school as healthy as possible during the winter months. Thank you.

A reminder to our Reception families that the school health team will be in school on Monday to measure the Reception children, you have received full information about this check via email. All children will be weighed and measured unless you have opted for them not to take part in this as per the information given.

Attendance

Our overall attendance target is 96%. Our overall attendance this week is 94.39%. Lion class has achieved the highest attendance this week, with 99.33% attendance, very narrowly followed by Ladybird class with 99.32%. Well done to both classes.

Important message from our Governing Body

We are currently looking for new governors, and in particular a parent governor.

School governors are volunteers who work as a team (governing body) to support the school at a strategic level. The role of a parent governor is no different to any other governor. Governing boards make strategic decisions and work together to:

- develop a vision and strategy for the school
- oversee financial performance and make sure money is well spent
- hold the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school
- engage with pupils, staff, parents and the wider school community to understand their views

Being a school governor is a commitment to attending governing body meetings which consider these issues. Parent governors offer their perspective on issues being discussed and they are not expected to represent the parent body or act as a spokesperson. Full training and support are also provided for the role. If you are interested to find out more, please contact the office or catch me on the gate.

Pupil Premium Grant

When your child was admitted to the school we checked their eligibility for the Pupil Premium Grant. Children in receipt of the Pupil Premium Grant receive funded benefits throughout the school year from us as a school and from the local authority.
