Coombe Hill Infants School is a very special place, full of love, warmth and a determination for our children to succeed. I am proud to be able to add my name to the list of custodians who have presided in my role and am sad but excited to pass the baton on to the next Headteacher.

I am sharing this news with you now as a recruitment process will begin shortly. This is being led by our school governors . The long lead-in time is aimed at ensuring that the new Headteacher has a good transition period leading up to the next school year.

Our school is fantastic. We have such a wonderful community of families and staff. This was recognised in our recent Ofsted report. I will continue to work hard to ensure that I leave the school in the very best position and that it continues to thrive and continually improve.

Over the coming months, I will get the chance to say goodbye properly, but for now, it's business as usual!

Reading

As you know, reading is so important to us at CHI - learning to read and reading for pleasure. Research strongly suggests that '*enjoyment of reading*' and enthusiasm to '*read for pleasure*' is the most important indicator of your child's future success and will have a significant impact on their wellbeing and mental health all the way into adulthood. As parents and carers you can support the love of reading at home by listening to your child read and reading to them daily. Bedtime stories and reading at home, not only increase academic ability, but also help to strengthen family relationships and foster a lifelong love of books. Keep making reading a priority at home.

As you know, the **SPARK! Book Awards** are back! Mrs Jakob announced the shortlisted books in assembly <u>CHI Spark! 2025 Assembly Slides</u> - Farah Loves Mangoes by Sarthak Sinha, Gina Kaminski Saves the Wolf by Craig Barr-Green, Who Ate Steve by Susannah Lloyd and and If I were Prime Minister by Trygue Skaug - take a look at the <u>Spark! Book Awards website</u>, Facebook or on X. Each class has a copy of the book and the teachers will read and read the books over the next few months. There will also be the opportunity to "meet the authors", enter competitions and then we will all vote for our favourite book and we will keep you updated. The winning book will be announced in July in an online awards ceremony in June.

World Book Day is on Thursday 6th March. This year we are asking all children and teaching staff to bring a favourite picture book to school and wear pyjamas or your most comfortable clothes! We are looking forward to a day full of books and reading! We are hoping to transform every classroom door into a book cover this year. On **Thursday 13th March, Neal Zetter, the poet** is visiting us again and there will be an opportunity to buy his books.

Planned absences from school


