We are noticing some children using inappropriate language in school and this is not acceptable. If you are seeing this at home, please can you address this with your children. Thank you.


World Maths Day

Yesterday was World Maths Day! In Reception, children enjoyed sharing 'The Great Pet Sale' by Mick Inkpen. They loved exploring money, looking at all the different coins and working out which ones they could use to pay for the pets they wanted. Year 1 have been developing their measurement skills by learning how to measure a range of classroom objects using rulers.





Meanwhile in Year 2, children spent the day solving maths riddles, estimating how many in a jar and playing bingo. They were creating art using rulers to create a variety of geometric shapes and using a code to colour shapes according to the number of sides they have. Children have also been using Colby, a programmable robot, to navigate a course to find the cheese!



Years 1 and 2 Maths Workshop

National Skipping Day

The children had so much fun and skipping has many benefits such as enhancing children's coordination, concentration, cooperation, and communication through the fun and engaging activity of skipping. Authorised absences

If your absence request is for a hospital appointment, an emergency dental appointment, a religious observation (where the day is exclusively set apart for religious observance), a visit to another school, an entrance/ballet/music exam, please request a form from the school.

Unauthorised absences

If your leave of absence request is for any other reason than those given above **you must submit your request in writing (by letter or via email to to <u>admin@chi.rbksch.org)</u> giving full details, <u>at least 2 weeks</u> in advance of the intended absence period, addressed to Mrs Berry. Attendance this week

Our overall attendance target is 96%. Our overall attendance this week is 95.91%. Lion class has achieved the highest attendance this week, with 96.65% attendance, narrowly followed by Ladybird class with 96.64%, well done to both classes.





Vomiting and Diarrhoea

We remind all parents again that you MUST observe the 48 hour rule regarding vomiting and/or diarrhoea. It is so important that your child does not attend school for a clear 48 hours after a bout of either of these symptoms, in fairness to other children and to our staff as tummy bugs can spread extremely quickly among young children. Even if your child has a single bout of vomiting or diarrhoea and then appears well they MUST remain at home for the full 48-hour period. We understand that this can be frustrating but please ensure that you do this.
