Throughout the week starting 10th February we are focusing on how to maintain positive mental health. Staying connected is a proven boost to our mental health and with this in mind, we are opening the hall on Monday 10 February from 8.45 - 9.45 am for you to stay for tea/coffee after morning drop off to meet and have a chat with other parents - younger children are welcome to come along too. She has worked with so many children and families during this time and has made such a positive difference to so many. I am sure that you will join me in wishing her our very best for the future.

#### **School Lunches**

We are pleased that the new school lunch system is working well and thank you for continuing to order lunches via Parentpay in good time. Please always check that you have your child's lunches ordered for the following week at the weekend. We are still finding that on some days some children do not have a school lunch ordered and do not have a packed lunch with them. Please ensure that you check that your child has a lunch order or a packed lunch every day. We also ask you to talk to your children about the lunches that you have ordered for them and remind them in the morning as occasionally a child is not aware and this has caused a few upsets when they reach the servery and are given a lunch that they are not expecting.

#### **Attendance**

Our overall attendance target is 96%. Our overall attendance this week is 95.22%. Ladybird class has achieved the highest attendance this week, with 98.67% attendance, followed by Squirrel and Leopard classes with 98% each. Well done to all three classes.





#### Leaving scooters and bikes at the school site

We have had a report this week of a scooter having gone missing from the small grassed area by the blue entrance gate. Please be mindful that you leave scooters and bikes at your own risk on the school site and that this area is highly visible to the general public from the path and road at all times. This area is not monitored and we do not take in bikes/scooters during the day or overnight for security. Please use the bike shed at the far end of the school car park nearer to the Junior school where possible or take bikes and scooters home with you.

#### Important message from our Governing Body

We are currently looking for new governors, and in particular a parent governor.

School governors are volunteers who work as a team (governing body) to support the school at a strategic level. The role of a parent governor is no different to any other governor. Governing boards make strategic decisions and work together to:

- develop a vision and strategy for the school
- oversee financial performance and make sure money is well spent
- hold the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school
- engage with pupils, staff, parents and the wider school community to understand their views

Being a school governor is a commitment to attending governing body meetings which consider these issues. Parent governors offer their perspective on issues being discussed and they are not expected to represent the parent body or act as a spokesperson. #### **Pupil Premium Grant**

When your child was admitted to the school we checked their eligibility for the Pupil Premium Grant. Children in receipt of the Pupil Premium Grant receive funded benefits throughout the school year from us as a school and from the local authority.
