#### Dear Families,

Another busy and eventful week. Your children are enjoying the learning and playtimes. The weather is getting much colder, so please ensure that all coats, hats, gloves, and sweatshirts are named. Please check the lost property box in the year 1 playground if your child is missing an item.

Thank you to everyone who is supporting our focus on good behaviour choices. This week we have been thinking about being resilient, which for young children means ignoring distractions and trying hard. This isn't always easy for young children.

#### How parents can help

Encourage children to ...

- · keep on going, even if a task is difficult
- talk about how you feel when you are taking on a challenge
- · praise your children when they persevere
- · help them find interests and activities that are absorbing
- talk to them about what helps them to concentrate



We are noticing that some children are struggling to make the right choices at playtimes, and there is some playfighting that we need to discourage. If your child's class teacher talks to you about this, please support us by talking to your child about this at home.

#### **Brakes Road Safety Week**

The children have enjoyed activities throughout the week which have helped them to learn and understand the importance of keeping safe when crossing the road and being near traffic. They had an assembly where they learned more about some of the people who help everyone to stay safe on the roads and they have been using road safety resources that we have in school to practise crossing the road safely. Please do take the opportunity to talk to your children about what they have learned and help us to reinforce making good road safety choices on the roads around the school.









#### **Reception trip to the Post Box**

This week the Reception children wrote a surprise letter for their adults and enjoyed a walk to the post box. One group was lucky enough to see the postman opening the post box and loading the van! The children showed fantastic listening skills and we were all very impressed by the questions they asked about the postal service. Next week we have a postman coming to visit us in school to help answer those questions!





#### Parent Workshop about our approach to behaviour management

We are running a Parent Workshop "Our Approach to Behaviour Management - and how you can support your child at home" next **Friday 29th November 2024** in the school from **9.00 - 9.45am**. Everyone is welcome to attend, we look forward to seeing you there.

#### Morning punctuality

We have seen an increased number of parents bringing their children to school after the gate has closed at 8.50 am. School journeys can be more challenging on winter mornings when it is cold, wet or icy with more traffic on the roads and parking even more limited. Please factor in a few more minutes for your journeys as the teachers are finding the frequent late arrivals disruptive when they have already started teaching. The day starts for children from 8.40am when they should enter the classroom, this is important settling time which sets your child up for the day. For your child, walking into a classroom where a session is already in progress can be unsettling and there may not be the opportunity for tasks to be re-explained to them fully. Please let us know if you need support with this.

We are also noticing that some children are being collected late in the afternoons, this means that their teacher has to wait with them after the rest of the class has been dismissed and it can be unsettling for your child if they are also taken to the school office which is very busy at the end of the day, please avoid this happening and leave plenty of time for your afternoon journey. A reminder that collection time for Reception children is at 3.05pm and 3.10pm for Years 1 and 2. If children are collected late from school clubs (after 4pm) we may consider withdrawing their place and it may also impact future club bookings for you.

These clubs are run voluntarily by some of our teachers and teaching assistants and run after school until 4pm, I am very grateful to the school staff for giving their time to this as our clubs generate a valuable source of income for the school. Reception children will also be invited to book clubs for the Spring term. The clubs are always very popular and several are often over-subscribed, there are no guarantees that we will be able to place your child in the clubs they request but we work hard to place children in at least one club of their choice. Please read the information carefully that will come to you next week. Payment is via Parentpay only so if you have not yet logged on and activated your account yet please do so, if you need a reminder of your Parentpay login details please contact the school office.
