Dear Families,

Your children have settled down well into the routines of school life. There is a lot to learn and it can feel a little overwhelming for some. Please talk to staff who will be at the door each morning if you have any concerns. If you think you need a longer discussion then please arrange this. We are finding that some children are play fighting quite a lot, this can result in children getting hurt. Many of them are re-enacting things they have seen on their ipads or on television, please keep an eye on what they are exposed to. We try to stop this as much as possible. Staff will talk to you if your child needs help with this, your support is vital please. Our expectations of behaviour are clear and later on this term we will host a workshop explaining our approach with the opportunity for you to ask questions. Our approach is based around positive Relationships. I have attached our Relationship and Behaviour policy and our agreed approach.

Clubs for Years 1 and 2

We received a high volume of requests for our Autumn clubs earlier today from the booking time of 10am. As always we look very carefully at all requests and try to be as fair as possible to everyone and aim to meet as many requests as we can. It is not always possible though and we appreciate your understanding in this. We will let you know early next week when clubs have been allocated and are on Parentpay awaiting payment. If any clubs have spaces we will let you know and offer these out again for booking. Clubs begin the week starting Monday 30 September until the end of November. I am grateful to all of the staff who give their time voluntarily to run these after school clubs for the children.

Attendance

We expect to see every child in school on time during term time, as long as they are fit and well enough to attend. Children who attend school every day make better progress both academically and socially. There is a direct link between under-achievement and absence. Children also find school routines, school work and friendships easier to manage when they attend school every day. We work very closely with any families where their child's attendance is a concern and track every child's attendance carefully. We do not authorise absence during term time for holidays and overseas travel and expect holidays to be arranged in the 13 weeks of school holiday when children are not in school, without any term time overlap. Each week we will let you know the overall attendance across the school for the week (our aim is 96% and above), and we will also tell you which class has the highest attendance of the week.

- Our overall attendance this week is **96.44**%
- Tiger class have achieved the highest attendance this week with 100%, well done to Tiger class!



Illness absence

We of course fully understand that young children can become ill and are grateful to parents for keeping their children at home when they have a raised temperature, have diarrhoea and/or vomiting (for 48 hours), and are clearly not well enough to attend - these are authorised illness absences. If a child is absent from school for 5 consecutive days or more, we require medical evidence to support this. Parent workshops and webinars



Our processes and procedures

As we start the school year, we would like to remind you of a few important procedures which enable us to work smoothly together for the benefit of your child.

• Reporting your child's absence

Please report your child's absence in the following way:

- email <u>admin@chi.rbksch.org</u> any time <u>before 9.15 am</u> every day of your child's absence
- ➤ call 020 8942 9481 any time **before 9.15 am** every day of your child's absence, you can leave a voicemail on our system at any time, we always check this
- if you are dropping off a sibling at school, please come to the school office and report the absence

All absences must be reported to the school office team, not to teachers on the classroom door or to other school staff.

Morning punctuality

Classroom doors open at **8.40am** for all year groups, when learning starts. We expect all children to be in their classrooms by 8.50am at the latest. The classroom doors then close. If your child's classroom door is closed you should make your way to the school office where we will ask you to complete a late form and our school office staff will take your child from you to their classroom. If you arrive late this is noted on your child's attendance record, with the reason for lateness and number of minutes late, we monitor this carefully.

There is always very limited parking around the school site and the roads are always heavily congested.

• Afternoon collection

All Reception children should be collected from their classroom at **3.05pm and year 1 and 2 children at 3.10pm**. It can be very unsettling for your child if they are not collected with the rest of their classmates from their classroom.

Illness

Vomiting and Diarrhoea

We ask you to strictly observe the <u>48 hour rule</u> regarding **vomiting and/or diarrhoea**. It is so important that your child does not attend school for a clear 48 hours after a bout of either of these symptoms, in fairness to other children and our staff as tummy bugs can spread extremely quickly among young children. Even if your child has a single bout and then appears well they must remain at home for the full 48 hour period. Thank you for your co-operation with this.

Parking around the school

The school car park is for staff/visitor parking only, we are unable to offer parking for parents at drop-off and pick-up times. Please walk or cycle to school whenever possible. If you need to drive please park considerately, and do not park over driveways, on the pavement on Coombe Lane West and not on the double yellow lines. Traffic wardens regularly patrol the roads.

Labelling items

Please check that every item of your child's school uniform is clearly labelled, including each of your child's shoes, as well as their coat, hats, scarves and each glove when the weather becomes cold. Please also ensure that water bottles and lunch boxes are all clearly named.

Coats

Please make sure that your child wears a named coat to school every day at this time of year. The children play outside several times during the day and must have weather appropriate clothing. We have a few second hand coats available in the school office entrance if you would like to have a look.

Dogs on the school site

Please do not bring dogs onto the school site.
