Dear Families,

Happy New Year! We hope that you all had a wonderful break with your families and friends. It has been lovely to see your children back at school looking so rested and ready for the new term. In our assembly on Monday we talked about our resolutions for the year ahead and we all agreed that we are going to be Ready, Respectful and Safe. We have new prefects in place and they will be meeting with me to let me know about good behaviour that they have seen, but also any behaviour that is not appropriate. We will be focussing on good manners, kind hands, feet and words. Next week our learning focus is **Respectful**, aided by Winnie The Pooh. For your children this means thinking about the feelings of others, sharing and being kind.

Building works

You will have noticed that during the break scaffolding was put up in the year 1 playground. This is in preparation for the roof to be replaced at the beginning of February. Initially this will impact Otter and Hedgehog classes. Otter class will be moving into the Studio building in the year 1 playground and Hedgehog class will be moving into the Library at the rear of the school. This move will take place on Friday 2nd February ready for the work to start on Monday 5th February. We will give parents in both classes more information in a separate email nearer the time. The next phase of the replacement will hopefully begin on 11th March, this will impact Butterfly, Ladybird and Squirrel classes. The final phase will involve Bee class. Again, we will let families know what the arrangements are for pick up etc nearer the time. Staff will work very hard to minimise disruption for the children and we will prepare them by visiting the new rooms, using social stories and making it a bit of an adventure.

School clubs - starting Monday

The Spring term clubs registers have now been finalised and clubs start from Monday 15 January. If any clubs were not paid for we have assumed that you do not want the space that was allocated for your child and they will not be on that club register, please collect them at the usual time from their classroom. Please see a reminder of the clubs timetable at the end of this newsletter. When you collect your child please enter via the blue gate next to the school office, the code for the gate is **9876**, you will be able to enter from 3.50pm (no earlier). In fairness to our staff who run the clubs voluntarily, please collect your child promptly at 4pm (or 4.15pm for Drumming club), we will monitor any late collections from clubs. Reception parents who are new to clubs, your child will be taken straight to their club classroom after school, you do not need to come to school at 3.05pm and take them there. A few notes about clubs:

• All clubs on Thursday 22 February have been cancelled due to the Parent Progress meetings. Payment for these clubs on that day will be carried forward and deducted from any club booking next term. Please speak to the school office if you have any queries.

- On Tuesday 20 February, **Drumming club** will take place in the Studio (the portakabin on the year 1 playground) and **French club** in the ICT suite.
- Love the Ball multi-sports club (Monday) please make sure your child has velcro trainers in school on the day of their club in a named bag to change into.
- **Soccer school** (Thursday) please make sure your child has football boots, shin pads, socks and shorts/joggers in a named bag to change into as soccer school play football on grass and it can be slippery and muddy. It would be very helpful if your child could practise putting on their pads, socks and boots at home.
- Wildcats Football club girls (Thursday) please make sure your daughter has velcro trainers, socks and shorts/joggers in a named bag to change into.
- Mindfulness club will now take place in Bee classroom (not Ladybird)

Communicating medical incidents

We have amended the system we have for communicating any medical incidents/injuries for your child during the school day. You will receive a form about any incidents involving your child where they have received medical attention during the school day, we are no longer using the green forms which were only being used for more serious accidents/injuries. If your child attends Connections, or a school club please ensure that you check your child's bag thoroughly every evening in case there is a form for you to see, otherwise your child's teacher will pass this information to you at the classroom door. For more serious incidents our school office staff will continue to call you to let you know in the same way as previously. If you have any questions around this new process please let us know.

Punctuality - morning and afternoon

A reminder that we expect every child to be dropped off at their classroom door on time, and to be collected at the end of the school day when the classroom door opens. It is disruptive to the class teachers and teaching assistants when children arrive late, and unsettling for your child who has missed the start of the school day. Likewise, it can be upsetting for them when they do not leave the classroom with the rest of the children at the end of the school day and have to wait for you. Please avoid this happening by leaving ample time for your school journeys, taking into account continual heavy traffic on the roads and on bus routes around the school and very limited parking. We continue to record all late arrivals and collections.

Childhood illness

At this time of year children can suffer more with seasonal illnesses. The NHS has a useful page in understanding whether your child should attend school or not if they seem unwell. Please see https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/. There is advice here for chicken pox, coughs, cold, earache, raised temperatures, conjunctivitis etc. It is usually appropriate for you to send children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. If your child has a temperature in the morning, please do not give them calpol and send them in.

Pupil Premium Grant

When your child was admitted to the school we checked their eligibility for the Pupil Premium Grant. Please get in touch with us if your financial circumstances have changed since your child's eligibility was checked and you think you may now be eligible.
