Google classroom

We would like every family to have signed up to your child's Google classroom. This is where you will find out what your child has been learning about this week and it will help you understand how you can support them at home. You will also receive any additional notifications about upcoming trips, forest school sessions, home activities or support we need in class. School clubs - please note

School clubs finish for years 1 and 2 at the end of November. The last week that clubs will run is the week starting Monday 27 November, clubs will run as usual this week and then finish (<u>no clubs from Monday 4 December onwards</u>). Please make a note of this if your child attends clubs. Booking information for the Spring term clubs will be sent to you later this term, and Reception parents will also have the opportunity to book a club for their child.

Lost property - Please label ALL items clearly

It is so important that <u>all</u> of your child's clothing items are clearly named, with 270 children in the school things can easily be misplaced. We spent a lot of time this week clearing through the lost property box and the photo below shows the amount of unnamed items that we currently have. All of these items are in good condition but cannot be returned to their owners as they are unnamed. We cannot store items for long so they will be taken to charity if uncollected. If you have bought second hand items from us please erase the previous owner's name to save confusion. The lost property box (shown below) is in the year 1 playground, please take a look for any missing items.



Please label all water bottles, lunchboxes, jumpers, fleeces, PE kit, coats, hats, individual gloves, scarves, school shoes and PE trainers, wellies, any other item of clothing that your child brings to school for non-uniform days/forest school sessions etc. We greatly appreciate your help with this, thank you.
