Dear Families,

I hope you all had a restful break, your children have come back with energy and great enthusiasm. We are all looking forward to a busy, exciting summer term.

Sam and his father Tony will talk about their journey and the importance of setting high aspirations.

Sam was diagnosed with autism at the age of 3. His parents focused on what he was able to achieve and together they challenged the norms and refused to put limitations on what Sam could achieve. He made history and became the world's first Ironman Triathlete with autism to compete at the Ironman World Championships and to get a Guinness World Record.
