Our Governing body

As many of you will be aware schools are facing a funding crisis nationally. Here at Coombe Hill Infants' we are facing financial challenges and it is something we very much need to focus on and plan for. We are so fortunate to have a talented, dedicated team of volunteer governors, ably lead by Dr Jo Taussig, our Chair of Governors. They are currently working on this situation with school staff and are looking at ways to reduce our costs but also to increase our income streams. Your support at this time is hugely appreciated and we will be letting you know more about how you can help in the next few weeks. We are always looking for more volunteers to join our governing body, we will shortly be advertising for these roles. Traffic problems and inconsiderate parking

Unfortunately this week we have had complaints from local residents about the parking of school parents. I am sure that the vast majority of our parents understand that it is completely unacceptable to park across or even on people's driveways. We have been given vehicle registration plates by local residents who are very unhappy and we have now instructed the Borough to send traffic wardens to monitor the local roads at pick up and drop off times. Please walk to and from school if you are able to - we have a very small catchment area after all. There is nothing more important to us than your children's safety and with nearly 700 children arriving at and leaving our school site every day everyone has a

responsibility to be careful and considerate in how they go about this to ensure that an accident does not happen. Thank you for your co-operation.

School Clubs

We have had a lot of interest in our School Clubs and have worked hard to meet as many of your club requests as possible. Payment for clubs should have been made by 10am this morning and your child's place may be reallocated if payment has not yet been received, please go to ParentPay or contact the School office if you have not yet paid. All clubs (except the French clubs) start next week, please make sure you know which classroom to collect your child from and collect them promptly at 4pm via the blue side gate, the access code was given out yesterday. Please note that you will not be able to park at the school for clubs pick up.

Covid symptoms and testing

We continue to be mindful that Covid is still prevalent in our community and we are continuing to be vigilant if any child shows symptoms in school. We urge you not to send your child in to school if they have a cough - in all likelihood you will be asked to collect them and take them for a PCR test. Please remember that Lateral Flow tests (home test kits) are to test anyone who is not showing symptoms. A PCR test at a test site must be arranged for anyone showing any one of the Covid symptoms of a cough, a raised temperature or loss of sense of taste or smell. The PCR test turnaround time at the moment is usually within 24 hours so it is no great inconvenience to arrange one and it is so important for us as a school to stay as safe as possible. We have Lateral Flow test kits available from the School office for you to collect.
