Parent Chats

As we reach the final weeks of this half term we would like to invite all parents in for a parent/teacher meeting during the week before half term. Please look out for the sign-up sheets, they will be released on Monday morning at 10am and you can sign up online. We are offering a choice of afternoons and there is an expectation that teachers meet all parents and carers. Please avoid requesting separate meetings with staff - all of our teachers are running early morning groups and after school clubs so they are very time limited.

Safeguarding

Safeguarding your children is our main priority and here at Coombe Hill Infants' safeguarding is everyone's responsibility. Please remain vigilant and if you are concerned about a child or young person please call Kingston Children's services on 020 8547 5008. If you feel that a child or young person is in immediate danger please call the police. Our safeguarding and child protection policies can be found on our school website. The NSPCC play a vital role in Child protection. Their website is very informative and has a section called Childline Kids which is dedicated to supporting children under 12. Behaviour focus

Our behaviour focus this week has been Resourceful. Next week we will be thinking about Reasoning - listening to others and making the right choices. Please talk to your children about this, we will be particularly focusing on good listening.

Chicken Pox and general illness

We understand that young children often pick up bugs, particularly during this term and we continue to be vigilant to coughs and temperatures, and we have also seen an increasing number of children with chicken pox this week. However, we are finding that there are more children currently absent than normal for minor illness. If you are unsure about whether to send your child in to school please call us. If your child has a mild cold or stomach ache it is often better to bring them in, we will closely monitor them and will always call you if they become unwell during the day. If your child has a bout of vomiting or diarrohea they must be kept at home for 48 hours since their last bout. May we also remind you that if your child is absent you **must** call the school office before **9.10 am**, you may leave a message on our absence phone line or email admin@chi.rbksch.org. Our office staff are having to spend too much time chasing up absent pupils. It is our legal responsibility to account for every child on our register each day so we will call you each hour until we talk to you. Please help us by contacting us promptly on each day of absence.

Flu immunisations

Please note that the deadline for registering your child for a flu vaccination has been extended to midnight on Sunday 10 October. Whether or not you consent to your child receiving the flu vaccination we ask you to complete the form. Information containing the link to sign up is attached.

Parent Volunteers

Thank you to parents who have volunteered to help with Forest school sessions, staff are very grateful and we are hoping that we can start to invite parents/carers in to help in school with other activities after half term, please could we remind you that all parents/carers who help in school are required to have a valid DBS certificate. Please contact the School Office to arrange this.

Adventure Playground after school

Following my message last week about an increase in litter on the Adventure Playground we are happy to report that this has improved, thank you. Please could you supervise your children carefully if using the playground. All children must be accompanied by an adult if they are being sent up to use the toilets. Please do not allow your child to use the bikes, patio toys or toys in the shed. We have also noticed that some children are climbing up the climbing wall and onto the top of the decking, this is really unsafe and your children know that this is not allowed, please support us with this. Can we also remind you that the children in Coombe Connections use the playground at 3.45 p.m. Please start to leave at 3.40 pm when the bell is rung.
