Dear Parents and Carers,

We are keeping our fingers crossed for the weather and are sure it is going to be a lovely family event.

It is so wonderful to start to see more of you coming in to help us in school, this partnership with you makes such a difference. Special thanks to the wonderful group of parents who have been organising our books, this is a huge job and we are very grateful as these books can now be used by your children. Please let your class teacher know if you are able to help in any way. Just a little reminder that we do require all volunteers to have a valid DBS check (a DBS issued by our school), please ask at the office for more information.

Positive Covid cases in school

As you are aware we have had a number of positive Covid cases reported to us across the school this week with a cluster in Otter class. In total we have 8 positive Covid cases across year 1 and 2. In line with government guidance we have consulted Public Health England for advice, please find attached a letter with their response. We have implemented the following measures for Otter class this week:

- Eating lunch in their classroom
- Separate play times to the rest of the school
- No assemblies
- Higher vigilance around hand hygiene
- Increased ventilation in the classroom

We urge you to carry out a Lateral Flow Test on your child on Sunday evening before they come in on Monday so that any asymptomatic cases can be isolated, and of course arrange a PCR test if your child has any Covid symptoms, however mild.

Hopefully these measures are temporary and with everyone's co-operation across the school we can quickly restrict this outbreak. If your child does become ill at school we will call you to come and pick them up. Our Office staff have to isolate and wait with your child and it would really help us if you can come as promptly as possible, if you are unavailable we will try your other named emergency contacts.

Phonics and Early Reading meetings

The aim of the meeting is to update you on the new phonic approach being taught in school but also to give ideas for helping your child at home.
