Covid testing

Please continue to be vigilant to any Covid symptoms that your child may be displaying if they are unwell. If your child has a raised temperature, a cough or loss of sense or taste (however mild) you must still arrange a PCR test for them in the usual way via https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test. We still have Covid cases being reported within our school community and even though restrictions have been lifted we are still cautious and mindful of vulnerable people and we will send any child displaying

symptoms home for a PCR test. We are no longer able to supply LFT kits to all families so please order test kits for your household via https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests.

Bites and rashes

Several parents have mentioned to us over the last couple of weeks that their children have insect type bites or a rash on them. We have investigated this carefully to make sure that children are not receiving bites from any source in the school. Several classrooms have been fumigated and soft furnishings removed as a precaution. Today our pest control company checked the playground and outdoor areas and closely inspected the classrooms and there is no evidence of any pest that could be causing bites to children in school. Public advice is that if you are concerned about rashes or possible bites on your child, it is important that you seek medical attention.

The Alligator's Mouth bookshop events

We are very grateful to the Alligator's Mouth bookshop in Richmond who provided the books for the children to spend their tokens on for World Book Day yesterday. The Alligator's Mouth hold regular events in the bookshop that may be of interest to you and your children. The children's author Sophy Henn will be hosting a "Pizazz v the Demons" themed reading and activities event on Saturday 19 March at 11am for aged 5+ children. Those of you with pre-school children may be interested in their story time sessions on Wednesdays at 11am, no booking required, sessions are £5 each and if you make a purchase of over £5 on the day the session is free of charge. The bookshop staff read at least two picture books, often followed by a poem or song and is a great way for children to experience stories at a young age.
