Dear Families,

This week we had an assembly which focussed on good manners, your children responded so well and we have all noticed that manners are already improving. Please ask them about this at home and I am sure they will love to tell you about it. Next week we will be focussing on being Resilient, supported by Tigger. We will be thinking about working hard, learning from mistakes and trying to avoid distractions. This is linked to the Unicef Article 28 'Every child has the right to an education.'

Today I had a very productive meeting with our Prefects and the Year 1 and 2 School Council. Your children have lots of ideas and they are helping us to continue to improve the playground offering. The Prefects support behaviour and they are role models for the younger children. This experience really helps them to gain confidence and responsibility. Next week we will be choosing children from Year 2 to take on the role of Rights Respecting Ambassadors. Each week we will focus on one of the Unicef rights of a child and think about how this applies to us.

Punctuality

We are seeing an increasing number of families who are arriving late in the morning. Even being slightly late can make a child feel unsettled, it also means that our office staff have to spend a lot of time escorting children to their classrooms. In addition, we are seeing more children being picked up late at the end of the day. Again this makes your child feel worried, it also means that someone has to supervise them until you arrive. I will be monitoring this in the next few weeks.

As you know, if your child has a medical condition you were asked to give us full details of this in the Admissions form when they joined the school. We would just like to remind you of your responsibilities with regard to this. You have a responsibility to:

- tell us if your child has a medical condition
- ensure we have a complete and up-to-date Individual Healthcare Plan for your child
- inform us about the medication your child requires during school hours
- tell us about any changes to your child's medication, what they take, when, and how much
- inform us of any changes to your child's condition

Second hand uniform and joggers

If you need any school uniform items, please come and have a look at our free second hand uniform rails in the school foyer. Feel free to take what you need at any time between 8.15am to 4.15pm. We are not charging for these items and would like to see them put back to good use. There is an optional charity donation tin on the front desk. Aside from this, we are always grateful for donations of jogging trousers which are always useful in school. If your child is sent home from school in any spare uniform or clothing because of an accident we kindly request that these items are returned to us as soon as possible. Thank you.

Childhood illness

At this time of year children can suffer more with seasonal illnesses. The NHS has a useful page in understanding whether your child should attend school or not if they seem unwell. Please see https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/. There is advice here for chicken pox, coughs, cold, earache, raised temperatures, conjunctivitis etc. It is usually appropriate for you to send children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. If your child has a temperature in the morning, please do not give them calpol and send them in.
