WONDERFUL WORLD

READING

SPELLING

MATHS

When reading, spot: Statements, Commands, Questions and Exclamations

Shape

Do you know the difference between an oblong and a quadrilateral?

How many sides does a heptagon have?

How many faces are there in a square-based pyramid or a triangular prism?

Handwriting

Capital letters and numbers start in the air, whilst lower case letters always start on the line.

Which letters join in the air? Which are tall and which have tails?

Copy out 1 sentence at a time, insisting on using capital letters and full stops (or ! and ?) and forming letters correctly.
