

Year 2 Home Learning Tasks for Summer 1

MINIBEASTS & HABITATS

READING

Please encourage your child to read to you for 10 minutes every day. Also, please read to your child as often as you can and take time to discuss what is read to improve their comprehension.

SPELLING

Encourage your child to complete the hand-writing sheets, as these contain the weekly spelling patterns, grammar and punctuation. Challenge them to add sound buttons and syllable slashes.

MATHS

Please give any support that is required so that your child finishes the weekly maths challenge. Use Mathletics to extend your child, about 3 times a week for not more than 30 minutes at a time.

Project (optional)

Learn about games from around the world! Can you teach your friends how to play this game? Can you invent your own board game? How do you play? How do you win?

Take your sketchbook to the park or garden.

Time

It would be hugely beneficial to the children if you could encourage them to regularly look at the time on both digital and analogue clocks.

The expectation is that they can tell the time to the nearest 15 minutes, if not every 5 minutes.

Writing

Encourage children to write for a reason - thank you letters, keep a diary, write a shopping list.

Do ask children to take care with their handwriting. We expect clear, legible writing from every child.
